Susquehanna River Program Series concludes with Kipona and the Riverfront

Author and HSDC trustee Erik V. Fasick will present the final program in the summer series on his book *Harrisburg and the Susquehanna River* on Sunday, August 30 at 2:30 pm in the parlor of the Harris-Cameron Mansion. The presentation, *Kipona and the Riverfront*, will focus on Harrisburg's annual river festival, which was not always called Kipona and did not always take place on



Labor Day. The program will be followed by a tour of our current photo exhibit featuring historic images from HSDC's photography collection. Copies of the book will be available for purchase and signing by the author.

There is a suggested donation of \$5. The program is free for HSDC members. A mansion tour is included and begins at 1:00 pm.
